

BUDGET REPORT February 2023

Call to order: Sunday February 12, 2023 at 11:10 AM

John Unger called the meeting to order.

Edna Barisoff gave report: (copy included)

- Thanked congregation for staying after service to review 2023 budget report.
- Committee Katie Unger, Diana Vanderbilt, Lia Pinske and Edna Barisoff.
- Liaison member from Leadership team is Shirley Van Vianen.
- Copy of Budget 2023 distributed.
- <u>Revenue projection</u>: Anticipated offerings for 2023 \$119,000.00, other income -\$17,425.00. Bank balance as of Dec. 31 - \$29,375.49. Total Revenue Projection-\$164,800.49. Note transfer of \$8,000.00 from building fund, to cover cost of new air conditioner, already installed.

• Expense Projections:

- Finance and Operational costs are our largest expense. Includes payroll, utilities, office, national dues, conferences fees, professional development, insurance, WorkSafeBC, security and annual report fees. Have budgeted for possible new photo copier. Cancelled contract with Ricoh, so will use until fixing is not an option. Budgeted \$1,500.00 for new copier. Total expense projections for Finance and Operational costs - \$110,406.00.
- Building and Grounds expense projections are \$17,200.00. Includes maintenance costs, Rose Garden, janitorial services, and Church supplies. Proposed capital cost of \$3000, upgrade driveway for past two years, carried over to this year. Thanked John, Don, Scott, Bob and Darlene and Larry, for keeping Church in good condition.
- Missions budget \$17,130.00. Total support of mission partners- \$16,380.00. Listed mission partners. \$600.00 – set aside for mission seed projects. Mission team will discuss projects for this year. Had two projects in 2022.
- Care and Connecting budget is \$4,550.00. Have enjoyed meeting together again, at Church, bible studies and luncheons. Thanked Trudy and Shannon for doing delicious lunches, and Trudy for years of service. Shannon's new team members- Myrna, Anita and Carol. Benevolent Fund – Sandra and Trevor - \$1,860, total - \$4,735.00. Thanked Lia for heading up card ministry. Thanks to those who supported Acts of Kindness cookie plates. Also, Chaplain Janet for giving spiritual and emotional care to individuals in hospital and care homes.
- Christian Education budget \$525.00 for Daily Bread devotional, books for library and materials required for bible study and Sunday school. Thanked Fiona for her support in library.

- Worship budget \$3,700.00. Covers pulpit, honorariums, copyright, Song Select and any material required for worship. Thanked Dave Kelly for filling in, in Pastor Ken's absence. Valley has granted Pastor Ken a full medical leave. Thanked all who step in to help with worship service.
- Total projected expenses for 2023 \$153,511.00.

Edna made a motion to accept as presented.

Fiona seconded the motion, voted, and accepted.

Caring and Connecting Report

Bulletin mail outs - Bulletins are mailed to out-of-town people or shut-ins once a month, on a rotating basis, to provide congregational information to members by Carol Dugalo. Usually, 7 or 8 are sent out each month. From June 1, 2022, to May 31, 2023, 96 have been sent. From June/22 to Dec/22, the stamps/envelopes for these mailings were donated by Carol. From Jan/23 to May/23, \$46.00 was spent and the invoice was submitted to the Church.

Caring Card mail outs - Lia Pinske continues to send out cards to members that live out-of-town or are shut-in for all Special holidays. She also sends out cards to people that need extra prayers or encouragement. Please continue to notify Lia of any members that could benefit from these cards. Donations of any stickers or seals for the envelopes would be appreciated, because it makes the cards look cheerier. The stamps and some cards are purchased by the Church, but Lia gets most cards from the Christian Book Club.

Lia also reaches out to our Mission partners by mail or email on a regular basis.

TLC group - This continues to be a group of approximately 7 people that Karen Macor chats with every evening at 7 pm. Her group has completed the chronological readings of the Bible. The TLC group consists of people that are connected with our Church, but don't always come to services.

There continues to be an offshoot from this group and others in the Church that connects with prayers and postings daily on Facebook called 'Good morning and Good news'. If you are interested in joining this site, please contact Karen, because it is a private only group where members are accepted by invitation only. The site serves as an outreach effort as there are members of the site that are not connected to Valley but share our love for Jesus. It proves to be a safe place of caring and encouragement.

Men's Ministry - Prov 27:17 - As iron sharpens iron, so one man sharpens another.

The Men's ministry is led by Trevor Caldecott. Breakfasts are generally held monthly at the church. During 2020 and 2021 only a few were held due to COVID but have since resumed. The only meeting in 2021, was in November and was attended by 8 men who shared an extremely lively discussion on 'Who is the invisible enemy?'

Many thanks to those that donated eggs, bacon, sausages, fruit salad, orange juice and bread. Trevor is grateful, as there is never a lack of contributors, or volunteers that prepare the breakfast and do clean up, making his job as the organizer so much easier. The men always share a good fellowship and storytelling in the kitchen too.

Please contact Trevor if you would like to attend any of these breakfasts and he will gladly add you to his list! There is always much food to enjoy and copious amounts of coffee to go along with the discussions.

Women's ministry

Shirley Van Vianen has been leading the Women's luncheon gatherings. A little survey was taken regarding what day of the week and what type of gatherings were desired. The response was wonderful and led to Shirley being able to plan and organize luncheon dates up to the end of this year. As well as meeting about once per month at a restaurant, alternating between Oliver and Osoyoos, there was one bagged lunch held at the church in April 2023. The gatherings at the restaurants are very well attended for the joy of being together and sharing a meal. The bagged lunch held on April 5, 2023, was very well attended and some Ladies brought a friend along. The topic, 'what gets you going on your darkest days?', stimulated a great amount of personal sharing and discussion that is not always easy to have in a restaurant. A second bagged lunch is planned for September. Monthly restaurant luncheons will continue through the summer.

Coffee Fellowship

Carol Dugalo has been getting our after-service coffee and snacks organized every week. As reported to Church members, the change in our local grocery stores has also changed or will be changing from being able to turn in our grocery till receipts to a point system where points can be exchanged for a gift card. Currently, only the two stores in Osoyoos are taking the till receipts but will be changing at some point in the future. Gift cards purchase the coffee, tea, cream, and sugar that we use. As well the cleaning supplies and luncheon supplies needed, such as napkins and paper plates, are paid for by these gift cards. Carol is thankful to her helpers, particularly Janet, Roberta and Don, who help with setting up and cleaning up each week. Thank you to all who bring in baked goods and other donations as well.

Church Luncheons

Shannon Ashe has been heading up the approximately monthly post service luncheons since January. Trudy Demorest stepped down from working with Shannon in December. Shannon is thankful for her team that has been working with her to continue bringing us these wonderful meals.
